WHAT IS A TRANSFER?

To be considered a transfer student at Bryn Mawr, you must have completed a minimum of one semester of college level work at an accredited two- or four-year college. You must also be under the age of 23. Students 24 and over must apply to Bryn Mawr through the Katharine E. McBride Scholars Program. You may also download and submit a paper version of the Common Application with your \$50.00 check or money order. (We strongly recommend that students apply online. Transfer Testing:

The SAT of the College Entrance Examination Board or the ACT (Assessment of the American College Testing Program) are required of all transfer candidates.

Bryn Mawr requires official SAT score reports from the College Board. ACT scores must be sent from the ACT, Inc. You should indicate on the registration form that the scores be reported directly to Bryn Mawr College. To do so, you will need to provide our testing code number. (See chart at left.)

If at the time of registration you did not indicate that you would like your scores sent to Bryn Mawr College, you should write to the testing organization requesting your scores be forwarded to the Bryn Mawr College Office of Admissions.

INTERVIEWS

Transfer Interviews:

- Interviews are strongly recommended but are **not** required for Transfer Students.
- You may schedule an on-campus interview by calling the Admissions Office at 610-526-5152 well in advance of your visit.
- Interviews should be completed two weeks prior to the application deadline.

INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS AND U.S. STUDENTS LIVING ABROAD

International Transfer Candidates
(Non U.S. Citizens)

Foreign citizens currently attending U.S. institutions who wish to transfer are eligible to be considered for grant and loan support from the College. Only candidates who complete the financial aid application process at the time of admission are eligible to be considered for institutional grant and loan support during any of their subsequent years of enrollment at Bryn Mawr.

1. **College Scholarship Service (CSS) Foreign Student Financial Aid Application**
Download the CSS Foreign Student Application from the Bryn Mawr web page at http://www.brynmawr.edu/financial/intl_students_financial_shtml or request the form from the Financial Aid Office. Fill out all sections in detail and provide additional documentation if possible. Incomplete applications may not receive full aid consideration.
2. **Statement of Parental Earnings** Each of the applicant's parents must submit letters (in English) from their employers stating the parents' gross income and value of any perquisites, subsidies and benefits.
3. **Deadline** To be considered for international grant and loan support from the College, submit all documents to the Financial Aid Office by February 15, 2008.

FINANCIAL AID APPLICANTS

REQUIRED FORMS AND INSTRUCTIONS

U.S. Citizens Living Domestically or Abroad and Permanent Residents

To be considered for grant support from the College, applicants must respond to the Financial Aid Intent Question on the Common Application for Transfers. Only applicants who complete the financial aid application process at the time of admission are eligible to be considered for institutional grant assistance during any of their subsequent years of enrollment. Meeting our deadlines (see chart) is important. Late applicants may not receive full consideration for funding.

1. **College Scholarship Service (CSS) PROFILE** Register for your customized CSS PROFILE at www.collegeboard.com at least two weeks before February 15. The Bryn Mawr College Code is #2049. You may begin completing the online PROFILE immediately after you register and pay the registration fee. If one or both parents own any part of a business or working farm, you must also complete the CSS Business/Farm Supplement available for download at the time of CSS PROFILE online filing.
2. **Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)** File the FAFSA as soon as possible to meet the February 15 deadline, but not before January 1, 2009. Most applicants complete the online version of the FAFSA at www.fafsa.ed.gov. To sign the online FAFSA you must register for a federal Personal Identification Number (PIN) at www.pin.ed.gov. If you prefer not to sign electronically, you may complete the online FAFSA and then print and mail the signature page to the federal processor. The Bryn Mawr College Federal Code is #003237.
3. **Signed Federal Tax Returns** Submit signed copies of your and your parent's completed 2008 federal tax returns with all supporting schedules and attachments, including W-2 Forms to the Financial Aid Office as soon as available, but no later than March 1, 2009. If you or your parents are self-employed, or have any portion of ownership in a partnership or corporation you must submit copies of the most recent business tax return with all schedules and attachments. Note: Transfer applicants who meet the federal definition for independent status at the time of admission are not required to submit a parent tax return, but must submit a spousal tax return if married.
4. **College Scholarship Service (CSS) Non-Custodial Parent Statement** If your parents are divorced, separated, or were never married, the noncustodial parent must submit the CSS Noncustodial Parent Statement available from the Bryn Mawr web page and a signed copy of the completed 2008 federal tax returns with all supporting schedules and attachments, both personal and business, to the Financial Aid Office.

Additional forms may be required as a result of special circumstances or if questions arise during the financial aid review process.
