##### Department of Chemistry

##### **Assistant Professor of Chemistry**

The Department of Chemistry at Bryn Mawr College invites applications for a full-time, tenure-track Assistant Professor position in inorganic chemistry to begin August 1, 2025. Research programs broadly considered inorganic chemistry may include, but are not limited to, bioinorganic, materials, and organometallic chemistry. The successful candidate will be expected to teach at all levels in the Chemistry Department, including in the general or organic chemistry sequence depending on expertise. Additionally, they will be expected to be part of developing and teaching a diverse and inclusive curriculum, including contributing to college-wide initiatives such as the 360 Program and the first-year Emily Balch Seminars. The candidate will be expected to establish an ongoing program of scholarly research which involves undergraduate and graduate students. A Ph.D. is required by the start date and post-doctoral research experience is desirable.

The Department of Greek, Latin, and Classical Studies at Bryn Mawr College invites applications for a full-time, tenure-track Assistant Professor position to begin August 1, 2025 in Latin literature, culture, and reception, with a focus on poetry. The successful candidate's research may be on Latin poetry from any period, and they should also display expertise in classical reception studies in any medium, which might facilitate collaboration with other departments and programs at the college (e.g., Africana Studies, International Studies, Comparative Literature). We seek a candidate who will be able to teach Roman culture including core canonical texts and Latin at all levels. The successful candidate will be expected to be part of developing and teaching a diverse and inclusive curriculum, including graduate seminars, interdisciplinary programs and other college-wide initiatives such as the 360 Program and the first-year Emily Balch Seminars. Candidates must have completed all Ph.D. requirements by the start date.

Preference will be given to candidates with a Ph.D. in Statistics or Biostatistics, but we will also consider candidates with doctoral degrees in other fields who have rigorous and broad training in statistics and experience applying statistics to real world data. Candidates must have completed all Ph.D. requirements by the start date. The successful candidate will show research potential and a serious commitment to teaching. The faculty member filling this position will develop and teach statistics courses at all levels, from introductory to intermediate and advanced level topics and will contribute to the College's Data Science minor. We seek candidates who are interested in working with students on research projects involving real world data and who are excited to contribute to the department's nationally recognized success in supporting women and students from underrepresented groups in mathematics. The successful candidate will be expected to be a part of developing and teaching a diverse and inclusive curriculum, including interdisciplinary programs and other college-wide initiatives such as the 360 Program and the first-year Emily Balch Seminars.
